Summary of My Activities and Future Plans

My research interests thus far have been characterized by who I am and where I come from: I am a Bedouin woman, a social worker, and a member of a traditional society. My research has focused on trying to understand the experience of Bedouin women in a population undergoing processes of change and the ramifications of these changes on their perception of marital life, home, the representation of the good woman, the natural resources in their lives, the experiences of educated religious young women in the secular academic space, the experience of young women who grew up and lived in polygamous families, the experiences of child brides in this society, masculinity among educated Bedouin young men, Social aspects of deafness in the Bedouin population, and the experience of women and mothers of deaf children.

As a social worker and social work educator, I extensively researched the challenges and experiences of social workers in Arab society and social work in conflict areas.

As a part of my mission, I developed unique programs that connect the School of Social Work to the Bedouin society, such as "El-Ausaj" A Unique Social Work Journey, for the promotion and professional development of social workers and "Connecting Bridge" integrating social work graduates of Arab universities in social services in Israel.

In the next five years, I plan to move ahead with research in additional areas.

1.Indigenous knowledge

Indigenous knowledge in traditional societies, the degree to which it is used, and its effectiveness in social work practice. At the same time, it is compared with indigenous and tribal societies worldwide and among immigrants in European countries. I have built a relationship with the School of Social Work, University of Applied Sciences and Arts Northwestern Switzerland FHNW, Leiden University, and Dodoma University in the last two years. In 2024 I am being on sabbatical; the first part will be at State College, Pennsylvania, and the second will be in Doha. The focus will be on the influence of government policies on the indigenous knowledge of indigenous populations, an examination of the awareness of social workers of indigenous knowledge in Western academe and education toward decolonization of social work.

2. Young adults in traditional societies and societies in transition

Young adults in every society are a particular age group; unlike the generation of older adults, who symbolize the past and the culture, the young adults are the generation of the future, which represents progress and openness. Young adults in traditional societies contend with many challenges.

3. Masculinity

I have studied masculinity's meaning in educated Bedouin men's lives in recent years. The Bedouin society is patriarchal, granting men status, power, advantage, and the authority to control women. Educated Bedouin men feel that this power is imposed on them. In the following years, I will delve more deeply into the meaning of masculinity among the following groups: Three generations of Bedouin men, Adolescents, Young Bedouin adults who are involved in crime, and Young Bedouin adults who have acquired higher education. The study will also address the meaning of masculinity as perceived by three generations of Bedouin women.

4. The role of social workers in areas of conflict

Social workers often must practice under conditions of war, regional conflicts, and local uprisings. However, their practice focuses mainly on normative social problems such as domestic violence and crime and does not sufficiently address the conflict's influence at the macro level. Future research will focus on the meaning of being a social worker in a conflict area challenge.
